19 Course Description:

This course provides students with a general introduction to the religion of Islam and Islamic studies. It starts with a brief introduction talks about the emergence of Islam. This course discusses the origin and the meaning of the word Islam both linguistically and technically. The course also gives an introduction to the Quran, Sunnah and Islamic sciences and Law, in addition to the philosophy and conditions of ijtihad in Islam. The objectives of Islamic law, Pillars of Islam, Pillars of faith, Characteristics of Islamic culture and law and Muslim personality.

It includes also the fields of Islamic culture in faith, worship, relations, morals, knowledge and preaching; the struggle between cultures, the challenges facing the Islamic culture, its aspects and ways of solutions; the position of Islamic culture in the Muslim life and the future of the Islamic culture under the contemporary universe.

24 Course Policies:

A- This course is designed to be two-thirds class meetings and one-third online learning. This means that you are expected to attend class at the university every Sunday and Tuesday.
