	This course aims to establish the concept of culture; Islamic culture and its position among the other international cultures; to introduce the sources of Islamic culture, its bases, characteristics, effects. It includes also the fields of Islamic culture in faith, worship, relations, morals, knowledge and preaching; the struggle between cultures, the challenges facing the Islamic culture, its aspects and ways of solutions; the position of Islamic culture in the Muslim life and the future of the Islamic culture under the contemporary universe.	
Course Number 0401111	Course title Qur'anic Sciences	Credit hours 3
Perquisites:		
Course description:		
	The course aims at familiarizing the student with various aspects pertaining to reasons of revelation, Qur'anic studies such as: revelation, history of revelation, translation, inimitability of the Qur'an, manuscripts, abrogation, recitations, refuting accusations against the Qur'an, and exegesis bases.	
Course Number 401099	Course title Preliminary Qur'anic Recitation 99	Credit hours 3
Perquisites:		
Course description:		
	This course deals with basic knowledge about the Qur'an, the main principles of correct reading of the Qur'an free from obvious melody, and the basics of recitation and tajweed rules. It covers the definition of the Holy Qur'an, its writing and terminology, the basics of Arabic reading and spelling to ensure that the student is free from obvious melody, and the basics of tajweed rulings. The fundamentals of tajweed rules by knowing the appearance, mudgham, hidden, ghna and mududud without the details of those rules, based on the Quran's drawing, and applying this in practice by reciting the last six parts of the Quran (from Surat al-Shura to Surat al-Nas) under the	

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supervision of the teacher and asking the student to read these parts to a licensed sheikh.

Course Number 0431112	Course title Mastering the Art of Reciting the Holy Qur'an (1)	Credit hours 3
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Perquisites: (Passing the recitation proficiency exam or remedial recitation course)

Course description:
In its first level, this course provides a foundation of the basic concepts and skills for reading the Holy Qur'an and perfecting its recitation through foundation and training in the following topics: Ista'ida and Basmalah, the rulings of the consonant nun, tanween, and consonant memorization, as well as the sixteen types of mududud, in addition to the overall rulings of qalqa, with training the student to recite parts 21-30 of the Holy Quran (from Surah Al-Ankabut to the end of the Quran), and memorize parts 28-29, with practical application to recite the required parts under the teacher's supervision and follow-up, and reading the recitation parts to a certified sheikh.

Course description:
The course includes an introduction to Hadith; efforts of Hadith Scholars; development of Hadith studies; types of Hadith; Scholarship of Hadith; scholarly works in Hadith, chain studies, the bases of accepting and refusing.

To be able to explain the degree of the Prophetic hadiths and extract them from their authentic sources, through practical training in the science of authentication and extracting, its definition, importance and benefit, its methods and biographies of the narrators, in addition to how to deal with heritage books and its various sources according to a scientific methodology that combines originality and modernity

Course description: This course includes an introduction to the study of the Prophet's biography: the sources and characteristics of the Prophet's biography. The events and episodes of the Prophet's biography from birth to death.

Perquisites:		
Course description: This course aims to give the students a general introduction to the foundations and pillars of Islamic Faith, it covers the following topics: the concept of the creed, its characteristics and fundamentals; the meaning of faith, its ranks, essence, and monotheism, a brief study to fate, faith evidence, limits and aspects. Then the Qur'anic manner in presenting creed matters.		
Course Number 0401202	Course title The Biography Of The Rightly-Guided Caliphs	Credit hours 3
Perquisites:		
Course description: This course highlights the most important events and developments in political administration and military both domestic and foreign affairs of the Islamic state. It addresses the issue of how can we make benefit of these events in our contemporary time by analyzing the methodology of every caliph in implementing Islam.		
Course Number 0401203	Course title Methodologies of Research in The Sciences of Foundations of Religion	Credit hours 3
Perquisites:		
Course description: The course highlights the principles of academic research and the characteristics of successful research in terms of the principles of choosing the material, steps of research, rules of referencing. It concentrates basically on recourses of the fundamentals of Islam i.e. Qur'anic exegesis (interpretation), prophetic sayings and faith.		

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Course Number 0401211	Course title Exegesis	Credit hours 3
Perquisites:		
Course description:		
This course aims to give the student an idea about the principles of exegesis the concern of the Qur'an in the principles of belief and their effect on the establishment of the society. The exegesis of Sections: 29 and 30 is a requirement of the course, in addition to the meanings of certain vocabularies of the second half of the Qur'an.		
Course Number 0441213	Course title Mastering the Art of Reciting the Holy Qur'an (2)	Credit hours 3
Perquisites: (0431112)		
Course description:		
This course provides in its second level the conceptual structure of the alphabetic letters and their qualities and the basic skills of reading the Holy Qur'an and perfecting its recitation through rooting, deepening and training on the subjects of the letters and their convergence towards: The concept of exits and the mechanism of the work of the speech apparatus in the production of Arabic letters and sounds, adjusting the exits of all Arabic letters, as well as making sure that the student's tongue is established and developing the skill of pronunciation of the letters of the Qur'an and ridding him of speech disorders, studying the qualities and their reflection in mastering the reading of the Holy Qur'an, the course also deals with the provisions of the meeting of letters and the consequences of the meeting of letters. The student is trained to recite the second ten parts of the Holy Quran 11-20 (from Surah Yunus to the end of Surah Al-Quran), memorize parts 17 and 18, with practical application of reciting the Holy Quran under the supervision and follow-up of the teacher, and reading the recitation parts to a certified sheikh.		
Course Number 0431222	Course title Analytic Hadith	Credit hours 3
Perquisites:		
Course description:		
This course aims to discuss certain accounts of the Prophet from different aspects such as: their meanings, ascriptions (chain), and words from the following books:






