It assesses the Jurisprudence of Prayer, its concept, elucidating its wisdom, emphasizing its significance, and outlining its conditions, pillars, recommended acts, and various types. Further, it discusses the legal rulings related to congregational prayer, Friday prayer, the prayer of the sick, the prayer of the traveler, the prayer during fear, and voluntary prayers, categorizing their types. The discussion also includes the prostration of forgetfulness, the prostration of recitation, and the regulations concerning funeral prayers.


