For Bachelor's Degree program in the Jurisprudence and it's Foundations

First: Courses in the field of Worships ('Ibādāt)		
Course No.	Course Title	Number of credit hours
1040611	Jurisprudence of Purification and Prayer	3
Prerequisite course: None		
<p>The module addresses the study of the jurisprudence of purification, covering its definition and the wisdom behind its legislation. It also encompasses the rulings regarding water, the regulations concerning impurities. In addition, it assesses the meaning of ablution, <i>al-Wudu'</i>, its conditions, pillars, and recommended acts, as well as the rules and obligations of ritual washing, <i>al-Ghusl</i>, the method and reasons for dry ablution, <i>al-Tayammum</i>, wiping over the socks, and the leather socks (<i>al-Khuff</i> and <i>al-Jabirah</i>), along with their related rulings. It assesses the Jurisprudence of Prayer, its concept, elucidating its wisdom, emphasizing its significance, and outlining its conditions, pillars, recommended acts, and various types. Further, it discusses the legal rulings related to congregational prayer, Friday prayer, the prayer of the sick, the prayer of the traveler, the prayer during fear, and voluntary prayers, categorizing their types. The discussion also includes the prostration of forgetfulness, the prostration of recitation, and the regulations concerning funeral prayers.</p>

0406113	Jurisprudence of Fasting and Pilgrimage	3
Prerequisite course: None		
<p>This course addresses the explanation of the concept of fasting, its legitimacy, rulings, pillars, conditions, recommended acts, harmful actions, permissible and obligatory excuses for breaking the fast, those obligated to provide redemption (<i>al-Fidyah</i>) and its amount. It also clarifies the nullifiers of fasting, rulings on intentional breaking of the fast during Ramadan, making up the missed days of fasting, the legal aspects of <i>Zakat al-Fitr</i>, including its rulings, recipients, amount, and distribution. Additionally, it covers the regulations of <i>al-I'tikāf</i> (spiritual retreat) and discusses some contemporary issues related to fasting.</p>		
Course No.	Course Title	Number of credit hours
0406112	Jurisprudence of Alms and Charities	3
Prerequisite course: None		
<p>This course covers the religious rulings related to the worship of Alms, <i>al-Zakat</i> and charities, including its definition, legitimacy, rulings, conditions, and the types of wealth on which it is falls due, such as gold, silver, paper money, crops, fruits, trade goods, minerals, treasures, and livestock. It discusses <i>al-Zakat</i> on unlawful wealth, debt, mixed wealth, and addresses some contemporary issues concerning <i>al-Zakat</i>, such as monthly salaries, investments, stocks, bonds, companies, and the relationship between <i>al-Zakat</i></p>		





and taxation. The course covers also studying the disbursements of *al-Zakat*. Moreover, it defines charities, distinguishes between them and *al-Zakat*, as well as between them and expiations, *al-Khaffarat*. It then elaborates on the legal rulings of charities, specifying the conditions for eligibility, as well as the types of charities.

0406414	Jurisprudence of Oaths, Vows, Lawful and Prohibition	3

Prerequisite course: 0406352

This course addresses an introduction to the rulings of prohibitions, *al-Hazr*, and permissions, *al-Ibāhah*, then delves into the Islamic rulings related to oaths, covering their definition, legitimacy, types, pillars, factors affecting oaths, *al-Aymān*, and the expiation for breaking an oath. The course also discusses vows, *al-Nudhur*, highlighting their meaning, pillars, and conditions. It further explores various rulings on prohibitions and permissions, such as those concerning food, beverages, sacrifices, imported meats from non-Islamic countries, as well as issues related to clothing, decoration, including the rulings of beautification, and various social relations like mixing and contemporary issues related to the content of this curriculum.

Prerequisite course: 0406112+0406111

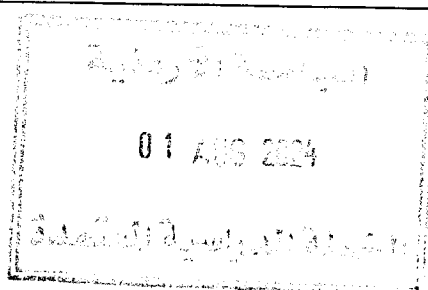
This module tackles a set of contemporary issues in the field of worship. It covers topics such as the rulings on transformation, *al-Istihālah*, the use of purified sewage water for purification purposes, dry cleaning of clothes, the impact of dyes and fats on purification, the use of alcohol-based perfumes, prayer on an airplane, the effect of kidney dialysis on purification, the use of impurities in medical treatment, rulings on prayer and fasting in regions with prolonged day or night, proving Ramadan using modern means, and the rulings of Stoning, *Ramy al-Jimār*, before midday, as well as stoning from upper floors in Mina, the obligation of immediate *Hajj* for those who have violated it and cannot obtain permission. Further, the course covers the suggestions of instructor regarding studying relevant contemporary issues.

Secondly: Courses in the Field of Financial Transactions (al-Mu'āmalāt al-Māliyyah):

Course No.	Course Title	Number of credit hours
0406221	Jurisprudence of Transactions and Participations	3

Prerequisite course: None

This course covers the concept of contracts and their pillars, the jurisprudence of sales; their definition, pillars, conditions and termination. It assesses also void sales, and their rulings, as well as options in sales; such as session option, sight option, condition option and defect option. It discusses types of sales; such as *al-Tawliyah*, *al-Wad'icah*, *al-Murābahah*, sale of manufacturing, exchange, and usury, *al-Ribā*, its concept, legal ruling and effective cause. It tackles also the concept of preemption, *al-Shuf'cah* and leasing





and hiring contract, al-Ijārah, and their rulings. This course also addresses jurisprudence of partnership in Islam. It sheds light on its concept, and types, as well as the companies of joint ventures, and farming. The student is trained to apply transaction rulings to contemporary issues and transactions in society.

0406222	Jurisprudence of Authentications and Donations	3

Prerequisite course: 0406221

This course covers documentation contracts, *al-Tawthiqāt*; such as mortgage, guarantee, and transfer, as well as donation contracts, *al-Tabarruʿāt*; such as contract of gift, gift of the sick individual, barrowing, deposit, foundling, loan. It studies their concepts, pillars, practical applications, and the jurisprudential rulings related to reconciliation contracts, reviving the arid land, usurpation, and its related jurisprudential rulings. The course also includes a study of contemporary applications of these contracts.

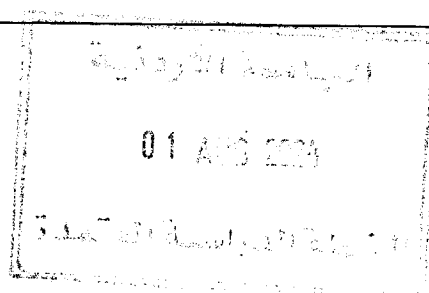
This course provides an introduction to the characteristics of the Islamic transactions system and its approach to addressing contemporary issues in the field of modern financial transactions. It introduces the efforts of contemporary scholars and scientific bodies, such as the resolutions of the Jurisprudence Council and the Accounting and Auditing Organization for Islamic Financial Institutions. It studies models of contemporary transactions related to money and finance, such as electronic currencies, and the operations of Islamic banks, including accounts, credit cards, profit-sharing, leasing, and study of Islamic insurance and its differences from commercial insurance. It also includes contemporary applications in competitions, prizes, marketing, and financial markets.

Thirdly: Courses in the field of Judicious Policy (al-Siyāsah al-Sharʿiyyah):

0406432	Jurisprudence of Punishments	3

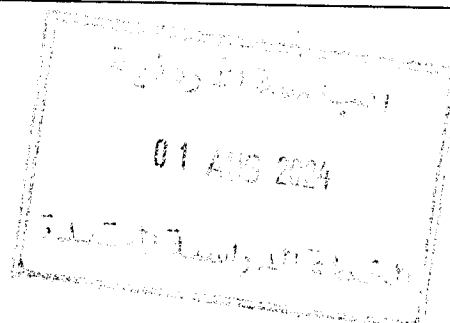
Prerequisite course: None

This course addresses the concept of crime from a legal perspective, outlining its types, the concept of punishment and its various forms, the characteristics of penalties, the wisdom behind legislating penalties, and the Islamic values in this field. The course also covers criminal rulings related to offenses against individuals and others, including crimes with specified punishments such as adultery, false accusation of adultery, intoxication, theft, highway robbery, apostasy, and crimes against individuals; such as intentional murder, manslaughter, accidental killing, and causation. It also explores punishments for deterrence, their types, the concept of blood money, al-Diyyah, its definition, and the legal rulings associated with it, as well as the regulations governing penalties and the legal consequences that result from them.

0406331	The Islamic Government System	3
Prerequisite course: None		
This course examines the concept of the state, its origin, pillars, the Islamic political system and its principles. It also studies the idea of Caliphate (leadership) and its obligatory nature, the methods of selecting the Caliph (leader), the conditions considered in the selection, the authority of the Caliph, and the general principles of the Islamic governance system, highlighting Islamic values such as consultation, justice, public freedoms, and the Islamic stance on them. The course also discusses the status of women and minorities in Islamic society. Additionally, it delves into contemporary applications related to the concept of the civil state within an Islamic framework, the authorities within the state and their independence, the principle of separation of powers, the restrictions imposed on each authority, political responsibility in Islam, and the state's stance on human rights.

0406333	Jurisprudence of the Jordanian Civil Law	3
Prerequisite course: 0406221		
This course covers the origins of Jordanian civil law, its sources, objectives, general trends, and sources of jurisdiction. It explores the general framework for understanding legal texts in civil law and investigates the sources of obligations that include contracts. Thus, it sheds light on contract form, contracting parties and contract object, the cause, and its types; in terms of validity and nullity. It explores prohibited women in marriage, guardianship in marriage, eligibility for marriage, dowry, marital rights, and contemporary marriage contracts. The course also addresses ways to dissolve a marriage contract, such as divorce and its rulings, khuluc and its rulings, and separation between spouses for justifiable reasons. The resulting effects of dissolving a marriage contract, such as waiting period and financial support, proof of lineage, custody, breastfeeding, expenses of relatives, and children's rights, are also discussed.

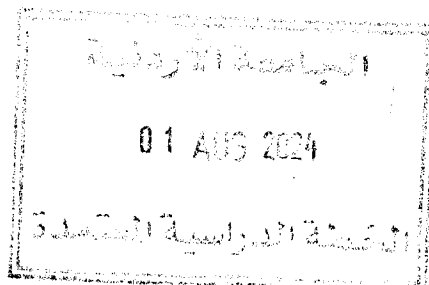

The course also addresses rulings related to wills, explaining their meaning, their legal status, and the obligatory will by Law, al-Wasiyyah al-Wājibah, distinguishing it from optional wills. It also discusses the execution of wills according to the Jordanian Personal Status Law.

It defines divorce, al-khuluc, and issues related to separation due to absence, imprisonment, defects, al-Licān, al-Zihār, and al-Ilā'. The

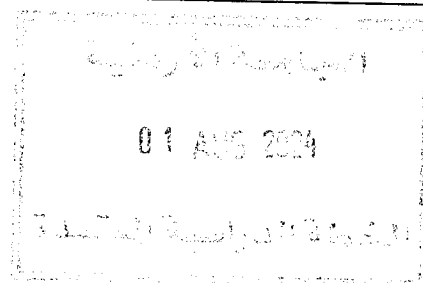

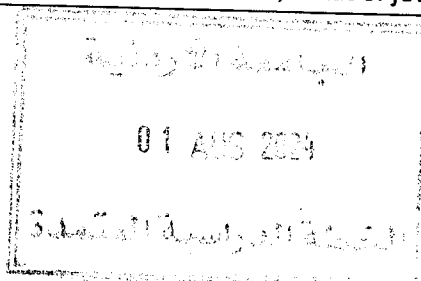

It also explores the prospects of research in jurisprudence and its principles, the methodology of jurisprudential and principles documentation, its references, sources, manuscript verification, and writing a scientific research paper in the field of Islamic jurisprudence and its principles that meets formal, methodological, and scientific requirements.

It explains the nature, evidence, legislative implications, divisions, and conditions of legal sources, with practical examples. The student studies sources of rulings; such as Qur'an, Sunnah, consensus, analogy, the actions of the people of Medina, equity, al-Istihṣān, public interest, al-Masāliḥ al-Mursalah, custom, al-cUrf, legislation related to prior communities, Sharḥ man Qablanā, blocking means, Sadd al-Dharā'ic, the statement of a companion, Qawl al-Sahabi, and presumption of continuity, al-Istishāb. The student explores the Islamic legislative methodologies and the way of utilizing them. Further, the course includes training students to apply legal sources in deducing contemporary legal issues.

ruling, al-cAzimah. It also covers the principles of balancing, al-Muwāzanat, defining them, their subjects, conditions, criteria, types such as balancing between interests, balancing between harms, and balancing between interests and harms. The course explores the relationship between the jurisprudence of balancing and Islamic legal evidence, along with its authentic and contemporary applications.

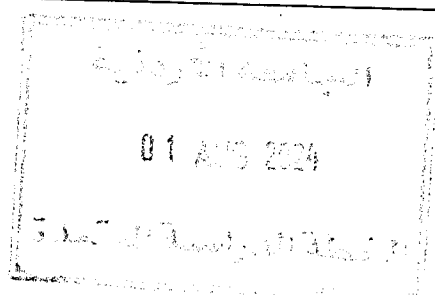

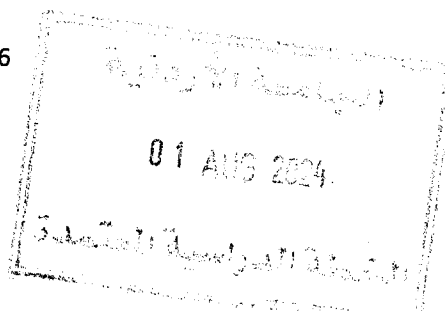

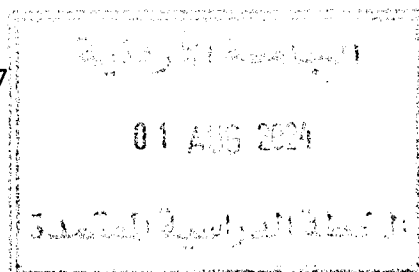

Additionally, it covers general rules for proper pronunciation, with practical training on reciting Juz' 21-30 of the Quran (from Surah Al-Ankabut to the end of the Quran). Students are also required to memorize Juz' 28-29, with practical application and supervision by the instructor.

Students practice reciting the second ten parts of the Quran (Juz' 11-20, from Surah Yunus to the end of Surah Al-Qasas) and memorize Juz' 17 and 18, with practical application under the supervision and guidance of the instructor.

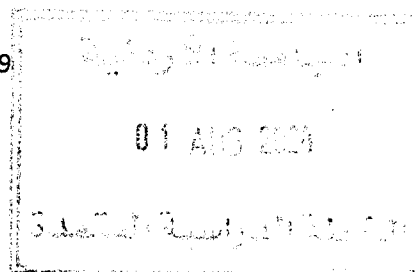

It also acquaints the student with the principles of preparing an effective sermon, the arts of delivering it, and the basics of dealing with the public through media communication means, public lessons, and media communication sites. How to address the obstacles that the preacher and teacher may face in communicating with the public, and learn the skill of constructive, purposeful criticism. It includes the origins of moderate discourse, and how to present moderate discourse through media communication and its various platforms in a way that reflects the tolerance of Islam, its human values, and its mercy to the worlds.

It also addresses Islamic ethics		



in general and its role in building the Muslim's personality: the Muslim's ethics towards his Lord, himself, his family, and his community.

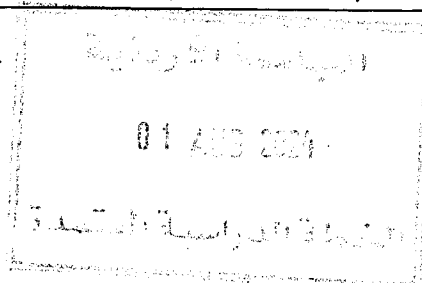

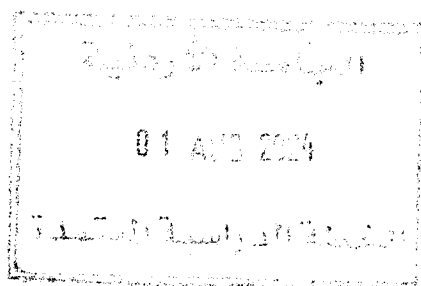

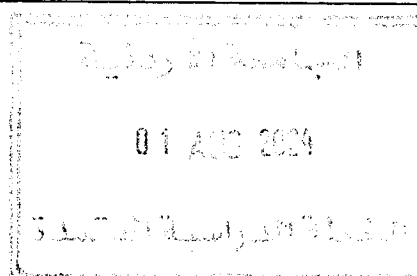

The second track: Training in Mosques and centres of the Ministry of Endowments and Islamic Affairs. Third Track: Training in the Department of Supreme Judge Department and Sharia Courts. Fourth track: Training in the General Fatwa Department.
