It includes also the fields of Islamic culture in faith, worship, relations, morals, knowledge and preaching; the struggle between cultures, the challenges facing the Islamic culture, its aspects and ways of solutions; the position of Islamic culture in the Muslim life and the future of the Islamic culture under the contemporary universe.</p>

<p>Course description:</p> <p>The course aims at familiarizing the student with various aspects pertaining to Qur'anic studies such as: revelation, history of revelation reasons of revelation, translation, inimitability of the Qur'an, manuscripts, abrogation, recitations, refuting accusations against the Qur'an, and exegesis bases.</p>		
Course Number 401099	Course title Preliminary Qur'anic Recitation 99	Credit hours 3
Perquisites:		
<p>Course description:</p> <p>This course deals with basic knowledge about the Qur'an, the main principles of correct reading of the Qur'an free from obvious melody, and the basics of recitation and tajweed rules. It covers the definition of the Holy Qur'an, its writing and terminology, the basics of Arabic reading and spelling to ensure that the student is free from obvious melody, and the basics of tajweed rulings. The fundamentals of tajweed rules by knowing the appearance, mudgham, hidden, ghna and mududud without the details of those rules, based on the Quran's drawing, and applying this in practice by reciting the last six parts of the Quran (from Surat al-Shura to Surat al-Nas) under the supervision of the teacher and asking the student to read these parts to a licensed sheikh.</p>		



<b>Course Number</b> <b>0431112</b>	<b>Course title</b> <b>Mastering the Art of Reciting the Holy Qur'an (1)</b>	<b>Credit hours</b> <b>3</b>
Perquisites: (Passing the recitation proficiency exam or remedial recitation course)		
<p><b>Course description:</b> In its first level, this course provides a foundation of the basic concepts and skills for reading the Holy Qur'an and perfecting its recitation through foundation and training in the following topics: Ista'ida and Basmalah, the rulings of the consonant nun, tanween, and consonant memorization, as well as the sixteen types of mududud, in addition to the overall rulings of qalqa, with training the student to recite parts 21-30 of the Holy Quran (from Surah Al-Ankabut to the end of the Quran), and memorize parts 28-29, with practical application to recite the required parts under the teacher's supervision and follow-up, and reading the recitation parts to a certified sheikh.</p>

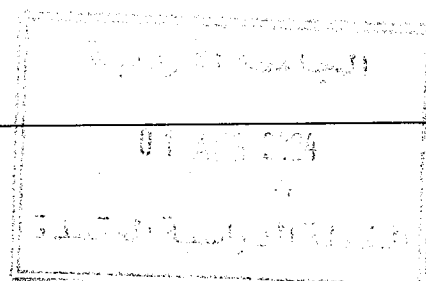

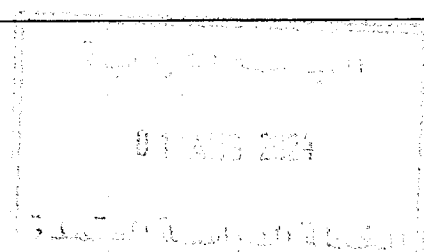

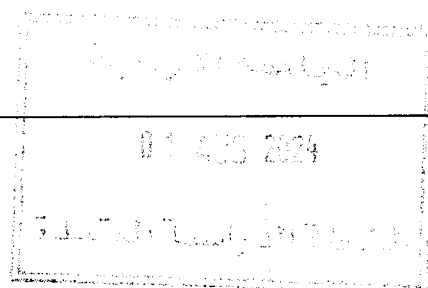

The course also concentrates on how the Qur'anic Story assists in understanding the Divine bases of change, in life, soul and society. An applied discussion is required on some narratives of certain Prophets

Perquisites: (0431112 & 0441213)		
Course description: This course provides students with a set of advanced concepts and skills in recitation and intonation of the Holy Qur'an, from both a theoretical and applied skill standpoint, and advanced training skills commensurate with the needs of the labor market. The student studies how to employ the science of stopping and starting to clarify the meanings of verses when reading them, and the ability to judge readings. Reciters, how to stop with rum and ishham, how to start with hamzat al-wasl, advanced discussions, warnings, and individual Hafs readings, and the path of Qasr al-Muffasil from the path of Taybah The student is also trained in the skills of holding courses, methods of teaching Tajweed, and memorization circles in mosques, schools, and Qur'anic centers for beginners and advanced students. This is applied to topics in the science of Tajweed that were studied in the courses on the provisions of reading the Qur'an 1 and 2, along with memorizing Surat Al-Baqarah and mastering its reading by heart with the rulings. And reading eight parts of the Holy Qur'an from a licensed sheikh.
